<p>Summer 1: adding the prefix 'ir' to words beginning with r</p> <p>1. Before a word beginning with the letter r, the prefix for 'opposite' is 'ir'</p> <p>Examples: irregular, irresponsible, irrelevant, irresistible</p> <p>Summer 1: Revision of all prefixes from the autumn term, applied to increasingly complex root words. Examples: incompatible, insincere, disgrace, destabilise, disproportionate, inconsistent, misdiagnosis, unconventional</p> <p>Summer 2:</p> <p>1. The possessive apostrophe with plural words – reference to grammar.
